Music

- Know that a pentatonic scale is 5 notes and it is used in traditional Chinese music
- Know that Graphic notation is a way of drawing music and can show how pitch goes up and down
- Know that a fanfare is introductory music to gain attention
- Know that dance steps can help to show the Structure of music
- Know that Graphic box scores can be used to notate rhythms

Computing

- With support, I can use the ready-made templates within using 2Design and Make to design the recognisable form of a building.

Science

Rocks:

- compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties
- describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock
- recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.

Evolution:

- recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago
- recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents
- identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution

History

- I know why it was called the iron age
- I know that by the Iron age people belonged to tribes, with chieftains
- I know hill forts were built for protection against other tribes
- I know about Iron age daily life; homes, food, introduction of commerce, changes to settlements, jobs
