

Hi again everyone,

Welcome back to another JAM - at- home! Welcome to children who have recently joined our schools so are seeing this for the first time. JAM is usually an after school club run once a half-term (free of charge) for all pupils who would like to join us, by people from our local Church of England and Methodist churches – but due to Coronavirus we have had to go "on line" like so many other things! Our fun sessions are usually based round a Bible story, craft work, games and simple worship. Just before lockdown we had our first All-Age JAM session when Mums and Dads and Grannies and Grandads and little brothers and sisters all came as well, and we all enjoyed our Pancake Party. We hope that one day we will be able to do something like that again... but not at the moment!

Today's story is from the Old Testament part of the Bible - and it is all about someone quite small (not that much older than you!) facing up to something VERY BIG and how he trusted God and God helped him! WE have all had to face up to some pretty big things recently.... like coronavirus and not being allowed to do the things we normally do, like not being at school, like coming back to school and finding it is all different, like being in a new class, like starting school for the first time.... Wow – God helped David to be super brave and to deal with something, or rather someone, super BIG!

We usually do lots of different **crafts at JAM** whilst we think a bit more about the story.... Well here are some suggestions for you to try at home!

You could get some old wallpaper or lining paper and draw/paint a huge picture of Goliath

Or you could find a stone outside and paint it, or write on it with felt pens (eg David trusted God) – but don't throw it at anyone!

Or you could make a bag – David went to his brothers and brought them food – maybe in a



bag a bit like this! You will need a piece of paper (about A4 size – it can be any sort of paper – newspaper, coloured paper, wrapping paper etc), scissors, glue stick and maybe some sticky tape too... follow the instructions here...
